Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor To Reopen Monday, August 27

Honolulu, HI – Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor will resume full operations on Monday, August 27th, following the closure due to Hurricane Lane. The Museum will reopen its doors at 9:00am. Guests riding the Ford Island Shuttle from the Arizona Memorial Visitor Center will be able to access the Visitor Center grounds and exhibits as early as 7:00am.

As aircraft move back into place around the Museum we ask that all guests keep a safe distance whilst capturing their photos and videos. Taking a guided tour is recommended to get the most out of your visit. In efforts to welcome families in the coming weeks Pacific Aviation Museum is offering a Family Fun Pass. Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor is located on Historic Ford Island, where bombs fell during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941. Walk on the Pearl Harbor battlefield where the attack began, enter the bullet-scarred hangars, see the control tower

and aircraft of the battle, including a Japanese Zero and the B-17 Swamp Ghost. Hear the stories of WWII heroes and their response to the attack that changed our nation and the world. Tour Included, flight simulators and café available.
